Whānau Pakari

Whānau Pakari is a community-based, no cost, whānau-centred programme for children and adolescents aged 4-15 years (inclusive), wanting to improve their lifestyle.

Whānau Pakari uses an expert team to support children and their whānau to make long term changes to activity, food and lifestyle choices, in a respectful and non-judgemental way.

Health New Zealand Te Whatu Ora

Activity sessions in Hāwera and New Plymouth for 4-10 year olds, two half-day workshops for adolescents 11 years and over, and a term of physical activity sessions twice per year.

The Whānau Pakari team includes:

- dietitian
- clinical psychologist
- paediatrician
- physical activity specialist
- healthy lifestyle coordinator.

The Public Health Nurse team are offering the **Bootrix (Tetanus**, **diptheria and whooping cough) vaccination** to year 7's and the **HPV (Human Papilloma Virus Vaccine)** to year 8's.

These are both part of the NZ immunisation schedule. Some children may have already received these immunisations at their GP or other medical centre.

Your child will be bringing home a form with all the information. Fill in Section A if you **DO consent**. Section B if you **DO NOT consent**.
